As an industry, the problems conservation now faces go far beyond boundaries and borders and taking a united approach is our strongest chance of making the much-needed difference that is required. The Zambesia Conservation Alliance (ZCA), in establishing a network of outreach partners on the frontlines of conservation provides a support structure and gateway for external partners like law enforcement or the private sector to access in one place. It also provides a network to share best practices, lessons learned and crucially in the fight against the illegal wildlife trade (IWT), information. For my own organisation, United for Wildlife (UfW), led by HRH The Duke of Cambridge, collaborating with a single alliance is the most effective way to share information with the multitude of members within our Taskforces. We have amassed large numbers of banks, transport organisations and law enforcement, all committed to acting on credible and effective intelligence relating to IWT. Our partnership with ZCA is a model that streamlines all of their outreach partners with our own Taskforces, paving the way for support both ways. Collaborations like this are the key to delivering the impact this industry so badly needs.

ZCA proudly announces the recent signing of a partnership with the Royal Foundation to assist with the incredible efforts being made through United for Wildlife.



ABOUT ZAMBESIA'S SHORT TERM GOALS

We have met many of you during an Outreach meeting, but we thought we would briefly outline again why we are here and how we can work together. The ZCA is here to connect the dots in our conservation landscape, the Zambesia region, by forming alliances between likeminded people and organisations. The team at ZCA are tasked to develop methods and systems to assist all our alliance partners with the efficient and effective flow of information. By doing this we can collectively understand the regional issues being faced and work together to combat them. We can then tell the whole story, where possible, to the conservation audience and ignite purpose in them to contribute towards the fight against loss of natural habitat and its wildlife. Of course, we do intend to individually help each one of you in time and build more awareness for your individual efforts and ultimately channel funding to your projects too. It is a humble beginning, but we are already delighted to see progress. Similarly we have been so invigorated by the many wonderful face to face meetings we have had with you and we look forward to engaging you all more as time goes on.

The ZCA has been incorporated in the state of Texas and our IRS exemption application for 501(c)3 status was submitted at the end of November 2020. We expect full IRS approval within the first quarter of 2021. We are still wading through the British systems to make headway there and we have an active Trust partnership in Zimbabwe already in place that is audited by Ernst & Young.

In March 2020, as the Covid storm was brewing, the ZCA was founded early into the first Zimbabwe lockdown, close to Victoria Falls, on the banks of the Zambezi. 

Maybe share something about your rangers' efforts or an incident that yielded positive results e.g. removal of a snare from an injured elephant or maybe you collared a lion or helped out the community.

Here are a few guidelines for any VIDEO content you record:



- Try to keep the footage fairly short (i.e. <5 minutes unless you are capturing something super cool and interesting that has to take longer).
- Use a phone or camera that can shoot in HD format if possible or at least semi-HD (here's a <u>GREAT ARTICLE</u> to give you some easy-peasy-how-to advice).
- If you use your phone shoot <u>landscape</u> i.e. hold the phone horizontally like the picture above
- If you can add a little <u>voice commentary</u> that will be great. Alternatively you can send us a text description along when you send the video in.
- The best way to share videos/images with us is via <u>WeTransfer</u> which is FREE and easy

<u>NOTE</u>: We do understand that you will also be pushing your own channels of media, which of course you must do, but the idea of you all centralising your information on these channels will mean you will build your following together as an alliance and many of our channels already have thousands of followers so you, our alliance partners now have access to them.

LEGAL SUPPORT

ADVICE & SUPPORT FROM OUR LEGAL LIAISON INTERNATIONAL ANIMAL LAW ADVOCATE EVER CHINODA

We have recently signed an MOU with specialist IWT lawyer, Advocate Ever Chinoda, in Zimbabwe, who will be providing our alliance partners with legal advice where needed. Once funding has been sourced, we will be asking Advocate Chinoda to undertake training for your scouts and anti-poaching teams, should you wish her to do so. These legal offerings will be expanded throughout the Zambesia region as we identify IWT legal experts to work with Ever. If you have need of legal assistance in relation to wildlife law please let us know and we can arrange an initial interview at no cost to yourselves.



IN THE PIPELINE

MORE EXCITING DEVELOPMENTS BREWING FOR ZCA

WhatsApp Group for Alliance Partners

One of the lead objectives of the ZCA is to create a real Alliance between our partners and in keeping with this we would like you all to join the Alliance WhatsApp Group. The rules of the group will be clear and only work-related issues allowed. The focus of the group will be to share ideas and problems that you are all facing in the field and finding ways to overcome them together. We believe this will be an exciting and constructive regional group of likeminded people connected for the common cause of conservation. You may decide to elect one of your team to be on the group or if needed more than one. (Maximum two per entity)

Conservation Science Alliance

We have had some fun meetings with young and old boffins. One of the common criticisms is that not enough information is being shared when it comes to the science behind good and bad conservation. We are looking to build a network of qualified scientists through the ZCA to encourage the increase in information sharing cross region and border. So, watch this space - we have a few "young guns" who will be in touch to kick this off.

IWT Information Sharing

We are currently in discussion with two organisations (and hope to have agreements signed with them shortly) about information sharing when it comes to IWT. We realise that this is a particularly sensitive area in the fight against IWT and are therefore working to ensure that all the necessary safeguards are in place. There is a need to build up a regional network for the sharing of information, through a carefully coordinated system, between banks and between transport organisations. We have begun this process with the financial sector and hope to be able to share more information with you over the coming weeks and months.

Building the Market Alliance

The ZCA is also building an alliance out in the Conservation market – this alliance may be made up of sports ambassadors, artists, musicians, companies, zoos and more. A good example of how these Market Alliance partners can assist is the recent composition by the Commonwealth Youth Orchestra of a tailor-made <u>ZCA THEME TUNE</u> to help us launch the beauty of the region and the plight of conservation in the Zambesia Region.
